Christopher Marlowe and William Shakespeare were twin stars in Anthony Burgess's intellectual and artistic firmament. Inspired by them he wrote and composed abundantly, from his dissertation on Marlowe's *Dr Faustus* as a student at the University of Manchester to the last novel published in his lifetime,

A Dead Man in Deptford

. On Shakespeare he was prolific: two novels -

Nothing Like the Sun

and

Enderby's Dark Lady

- a biography, short stories, journalistic articles and scholarly chapters, a film script, a television series, a symphony and songs inspired by his plays, even a ballet suite for full orchestra about the career of Shakespeare,
